Since 2017, Steve has served as the Executive Director of <u>Downtown Evening Soup Kitchen, Inc.</u> (DESK), a nonprofit, social services agency providing a range of support to people experiencing homelessness or living in poverty. In this role, he has built up DESK from a small, grassroots community organization, with two staff members and a budget of \$180,000, to a critical provider of homelessness services in New Haven, with 17 staff and a budget of more than \$1.6 million. Following the purchase of a downtown building in 2020, Steve oversaw the opening of New Haven's first low-barrier Drop-in & Resource center for unhoused individuals, including the building's <u>\$4 million capital campaign and renovation</u>.
