# **Research in Progress**

"Development of a postpartum planning tool" (Planning).

This project will prepare a postpartum planning tool based on available and validated assessment tools, expert opinion, and focus group feedback. The tool will assess common concerns across mental, physical, social, and familial dimensions. The purpose of the tool will be to assist birthing parents with planning for and assessing their own postpartum experience. This work will be community-partnered with The Nesting Place, a business that offers support to ew and expectant birth parents.

- "Development of a tool to assess diversity, equity, and inclusion in the classroom" (On-Going).
