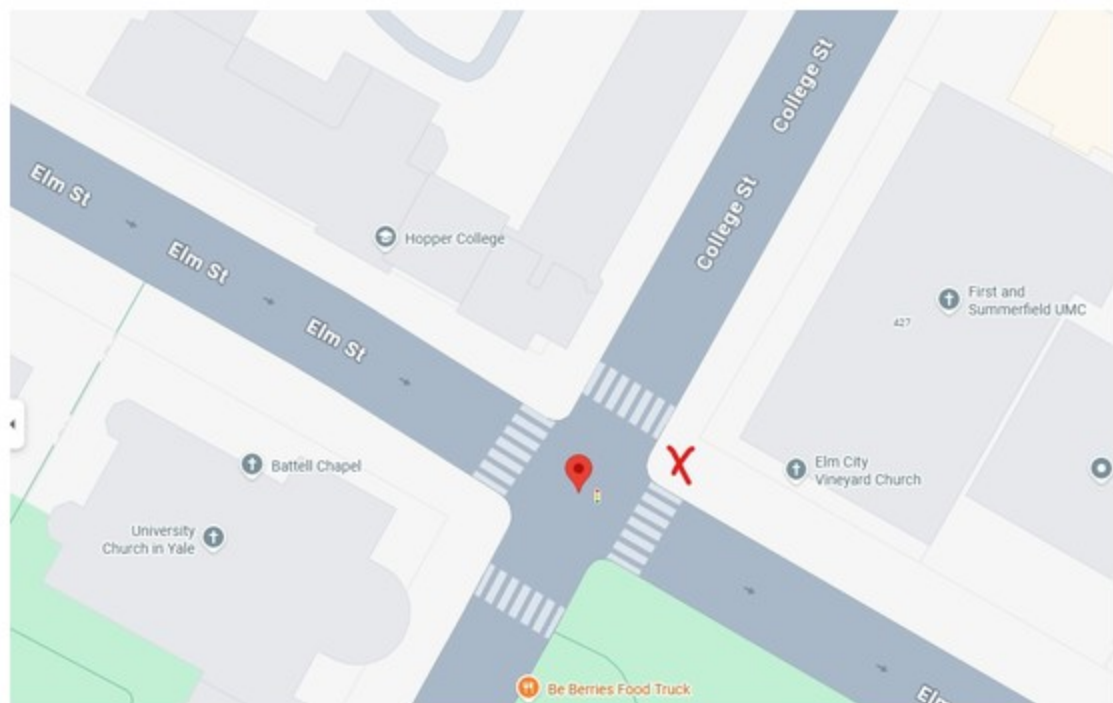
For these reasons, I respectfully and enthusiastically support this Order and urge my colleagues to approve the designation of “John Wilhelm Corner” in perpetuity.
