**FY24 SAFE STREETS FOR ALL (SS4A) GRANT**

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) established a new Safe Streets for All (SS4A) discretionary grant program to be administered by the U.S. Department of Transportation. The grant funds regional, local, and tribal initiatives and activities to prevent roadway deaths and serious injuries. The City of New Haven, with partners, have developed the Safe Routes for All (SRFA) Citywide Active Transportation Plan that evaluated ways to support planning, infrastructure, behavioral, and operational initiatives to prevent death and serious injury on roads and streets involving all roadway users, especially pedestrians, transit users, and bicyclists. This resulting plan is a pre-requisite for eligibility for the SS4A grant funds. The funding program is a multi-year program with \$11,040,000.00 available for FY24. Any awarded funds would be applied towards infrastructure projects and action plan implementation outlines in the Safe Routes for All Citywide Active Transportation Plan, with a focus on Chapel Street and subject to standard city regulatory reviews and permitting.
