Food has always been an important part of my life. My passion for food began with learning how to cook nutritious food for my children, which inspired me to graduate from Gateway Community College in 2019 with an Associate's Degree in Culinary Arts. My children also inspired me to build my advocacy skills through participating in the Bridgeport Parent Leadership Training Institute in 2019.

While attending Gateway Community College, I participated in New Haven Farms' Farm-Based Wellness Program (FBWP). The FBWP introduced me to growing food, and eventually led me to becoming a gardener through their Incubator Gardener Program. Through my 4 years in the Incubator Gardener Program, I grew a variety of vegetables for my family, friends, and neighbors.
