RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE APPLICATION TO AND ACCEPTANCE OF A RYAN WHITE HIV/AIDS TREATMENT MODERNIZATION ACT GRANT FOR THE PERIOD OF MARCH 1, 2025- FEBRUARY 29, 2028, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$5,722,896 FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES' HEALTH RESOURCES AND SERVICES ADMINISTRATION (HRSA), FOR EMERGENCY HEALTHCARE SERVICES FOR INDIVIDUALS LIVING WITH OR AFFECTED BY HIV/AIDS IN NEW HAVEN AND FAIRFIELD COUNTIES.

Dear President Walker-Myers:

In accordance with the Order of New Haven Board of Alders (Board) authorizing the Mayor to apply for and accept all grants on behalf of the City of New Haven (City), passed on 17 October 1994, I write to respectfully advise the Honorable Board of an application by the New Haven Health Department's Ryan White Part A Office to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Health Resources and Services' (HRSA), Rockville MD, in the amount of about \$5,722,896_The grant application deadline is October 1, 2024. A formal Notification of Award is expected sometime in February 2025. This application is required on an annual basis to continue services. This is a continuation grant following newly implemented procedures by the Board of Aldermen. With these funds, the New Haven/Fairfield Counties' Eligible Metropolitan Area (EMA) can continue providing AIDS emergency services to individuals infected and/or affected by the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) living within both counties (Medical Transportation, Outpatient/Ambulatory Medical Care, Housing Services, Medical Case Management, Food Bank/Home Delivered Meals, Emergency Financial Assistance, Substance Abuse Services-Outpatient, Mental Health Services, Oral Health Care, Health Insurance Premium & Cost Sharing Assistance, Substance Abuse Services-Inpatient and Intensive Medical Case Management).

The Ryan White Part A Office, under the jurisdiction of New Haven Health Department, provides program administration. Community-based organizations and other institutions such as hospitals and clinics subcontract with the City of New Haven throughout the New Haven/Fairfield Counties' Eligible Metropolitan Area (EMA) to provide direct services. The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Extension Act of 2009 and its allocation process is more fully described in the attached Executive Summary. Since this is a recurring grant, we are requesting Unanimous Consent.
