PURPOSE OF PROGRAM: The Kaiser Permanente Center for Gun Violence Research and Education is pursuing a world free of gun violence, where impacted communities drive the meaningful change needed for a healthy and safe society. The Center endeavors to transform the gun violence research and education field. They seek to change narratives about the value and impact of actionable, health-focused solutions by:

- Partnering with communities disproportionately impacted by gun violence;
- Uniting rigorous scientific discovery with community-led approaches; and
- Funding research and education initiatives that empower communities impacted by gun violence to create solutions to this national epidemic.

Funding is for individuals and organizations conducting research that:

- advances evidence on effective strategies to reduce community gun violence or firearm suicide in a range of health care settings;
- advances knowledge about effective strategies to identify individuals at highest risk of community gun violence and firearm suicide in healthcare settings;
- advances understanding about clinical practice to improve care for survivors of community gun violence or firearm suicide.

Kaiser Permanente Center for Gun Violence Research and Education want to advance evidence for interventions that reduce the incidence and impact of community gun violence and firearm suicide and promote well-being and healing where it is needed most.

BRIEF SUMMARY OF CITY'S PROPOSAL: This RFP seeks to expand the capacity of programs dedicated to reducing gun violence — particularly in marginalized communities, by addressing root causes such as systemic racism, poverty, and trauma. The initiative will strengthen infrastructure and scale community-based intervention strategies that focus on preventing recidivism and supporting individuals at high risk of reoffending. By framing gun violence as a public health issue, the program aims to build upon long-term, sustainable solutions that improve community safety and ensure equitable access to resources.

A key component of this capacity-building effort will be the expansion of data infrastructure and analytical capabilities. Enhanced data capacity will support comprehensive tracking of program

outcomes, real-time identification of trends, and continuous evaluation and refinement of intervention strategies. This data-driven approach will ensure that the program remains responsive, effective, and accountable in achieving its goals.
