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The curriculum consists of 134 modules (803 total pages) in the 2022-2023 edition. A total of 191 training programs (i.e., Pediatrics, Family medicine, & Combined Internal-Medicine-Pediatric residency programs and Pediatric Nurse Practitioner programs) opt to pay a nominal fee which maintains the website, and these programs give regular feedback on modules. Prominent categorical pediatric residency programs using this curriculum include those at Boston Children's Combined Residency, UCLA Children's, Georgetown, Seattle Children's.
