In 2011 my oldest son was killed in New Haven due to gun violence and I have spent the last 10 years of my life learning how to not only survive this horrific life experience, but also learning how to advocate to my community member about change and correcting the patterns of life that are causing our communities and families so much harm. I have worked alongside many organizations such as Project Longevity, NHPD, U.S. District and States Attorney's as well as probation to provide one message, change is possible, but it all begins within. I have become a very important figure within the communities of New Haven, not just Newhallville where I was born and raised now for 48 years. I am also a single father of a young daughter whose mother succumbed to the disease know as Sickle Cell the following year after the death of my son. My passion to end gun violence is not just something that I know needs to happen and should not exist to this magnitude, but also this fight is personal because I understand the parts that I have once played and the level of influence I and others that I have become familiar with can help alter the direction of our community over a period. I have built many great relationships throughout the City of New Haven on every level that I am very confident I am fit for this job.
