RE: ORDER AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ACCEPT FUNDING FROM THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (CTDEEP) UNDER THE FEDERAL CLEAN VESSEL ACT (CVA) GRANT PROGRAM TO REPLACE THE PUMP OUT STATION AT LONG WHARF PIER

Dear President Walker-Myers:

The proposed action before you authorizes the Mayor to accept funding from the State Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (CTDEEP) under the Federal Clean Vessel Act (CVA) Grant Program to replace the pump out station at the Long Wharf Pier.

These funds will enable the City of New Haven to replace the pump out station at the Pier. The current pump has reached its useful life span and requires replacement. The proposed new pump out replacement will be utilized by marine vessels to offload boat waste and it will provide users with quick and convenient waste handling. This new pump out station will make a lasting improvement to the aquatic infrastructure of the City.

The grant program provides 75% (\$48,750) of the required funding for the project, with the remaining 25% (\$16,250) coming from City facility funds.
