Policy Amendments

1. A pension task force will be established to study the issue of pensions within the City of New Haven and to recommend strategies.

 A task force will be established to study the issue of health benefits within the City of New Haven and to recommend options going forward. This task force will include City employees, Alders, and key community stake holders.
Under the "Historic Documents Preservation Program" authorized by state law, for every document recorded in the land records of each municipality, \$2 of the processing fee per document is to be retained by the Town Clerk's Office: "one-fifth of the amount paid for fees pursuant to this subsection shall be retained by town clerks and used for the preservation and management of historic documents." Therefore, the city is to:

1) Establish a separate account within the city budget entitled "Historic Documents Preservation";

2) Deposit \$2 for every document recorded in the land records in such nt;

account;

3) Prepare and send a monthly report to the City Clerk and to the Aldermanic Finance Committee, Specifying the amount of total processing fees received by the City Clerk's Office, the portion of that amount which was deposited into the new "Historic Documents Preservation" account, and the current total of funds present in said account; and

4) Pursuant to state statute, all such funds deposited in said account, are only to be disbursed

at request of the City Clerk's Office for its duties related to preservation

and management

of historic documents.
